Lead Hazard Control Program

- CSD administers the LHCP which is designed to:
- identify and control lead-based paint hazards in eligible privately owned housing for rental or owner occupants
- since 1992 CSD has received continual LHCP funding




- To maximize LHCP funding CSD sub-contractors are required where applicable to layer DOE and LIHEAP funds
- LHEAP, DOE and LHCP funds are strategically leveraged to deliver a package of services that will increase energy efficiency and mitigate lead paint hazards

LIHEAP

- Purpose of the LIHEAP Program is to provide:
 - Direct utility assistance to help offset the cost of heating or cooling (HEAP)
 - -Gas & Electric
 - -Wood, Propane & Oil
 - Intervention payment assistance in crisis situations
 - -Emergency Heating Cooling Repair/Replacement
 - Provide weatherization (limited to 25% of the block grant)







DOE WAP

- Administered by CSD for over 30 years
- Purpose of the DOE WAP is to:
 - increase the energy efficiency of dwellings owned or occupied by low-income Californians
 - reduce total energy expenditures
 - improve health and safety
- Focus on vulnerable population

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 – DOE WAP

- Purpose
 - Stimulate the economy
 - Create and retain jobs
- Amount
 - \$185.8 million





Program Delivery

- Statewide Service Area
- Agencies providing weatherization services 41
- Agencies providing utility assistance 46

Eligibility Criteria

- Must reside in California
- Total gross household income must be equal or be less than 75% of State median income
- Federally mandated to:
 - -Provide service priority to households with lowest income and highest energy costs
 - -Consider households with members of the vulnerable populations

What is Weatherization?

- Energy conservation measures applied to a dwelling to help reduce energy use
- Main measures
 - -in-home energy education
 - -Insulation includes attic venting, ceiling, wall & ducts
 - -Duct repairs
 - -Glass & Window replacement (LHCP Leverage Measure)
 - -Exterior Door replacement (LHCP Leverage Measure)
 - -Minor envelope repairs (LHCP Leverage Measure)

Main Measures

- -Low-flow showerheads
- -Water heater blankets & pipe wrap
- -Electric base load measures include CFLs & Refrigerator replacements

Health & Safety Measures

- -Gas range repair/replacement
- -Gas water heater repair/replacement
- -Heating source repair/replacement
- -CO alarms

WX Program Delivery Model

- Whole house approach
 - -Primary emphasis on installation of energy efficient measures
 - -Secondary emphasis on health & safety of occupants as it is related to weatherization services
- Dwelling Types
 - -Single family & mobile
 - -Multi-unit occupied and unoccupied
 - -Shelters (DOE only)

WX Program Delivery Model

- Lead-safe weatherization protocol applied to all pre 1979 dwellings
 - -All wx employees of Agencies and Subcontractors are required to be trained in lead-safe practices

Training Requirements

- Basic weatherization
- Combustion appliance safety testing
- Blower door and duct leakage testing
- Lead-safe weatherization

Non-Crisis Utility Payment Assistance (HEAP)

- Gas & Electric payment assistance
- Wood, Propane & Oil assistance
- Assistance is generally provide year-round
- Benefit is limited to one payment per household per program year

Crisis Utility Assistance Payment

- Intervention service to prevent the disruption of heating/cooling services
 - -past due utility account
 - -energy termination
 - -insufficient funds to establish new energy account
