

Why a Strategic Plan for Asthma?

5 million Californians with lifetime asthma

3 million with current asthma

Highest burden in young people 5-17 y.o.

<\$20,000 annual income 3x higher likelihood of hospitalization

7x higher rate of severe symptoms than >\$100,000

Why Housing and Asthma?

11% of adults with asthma exposed to tobacco smoke in their homes

13% cockroaches

Data lags behind what we know on:
Mold
Dust mites
Chemical exposure
Stress
Other triggers

What's in the Housing Portion of the Asthma Plan?

•Research, assessment, guidance;

Promote standards and model policies;

•Educate stakeholders

Augment home assessment, remediation and legal action

•Builds on success of CB/CAP symposium Healthy Housing for California: Using Code Enforcement to Reduce the Impact of Asthma (December, 2006)

•Established active advisory board representing asthma and health advocates, housing advocates, code enforcers, lawyers, property owners/managers, indoor air quality experts and others.

•Supports Indoor Air Quality goals for housing.

The Strategic Plan for Asthma in California: Housing

Strategy	SPAC Goal and Objective
Develop and promote standards, guidelines, model policies for asthma-safe healthy housing.	Indoor Environments – Housing, Objective 4C.2
Educate various stakeholder groups on reduction of housing- based asthma risk factors	Indoor Environments – Housing, Objective 4C.3
Augmentation of home assessments, remediation, legal advocacy. Increase understanding of triggers.	Indoor Environments – Housing, Objective 4C.4 and 4C.1



Activities

"Essentials for Healthy Homes" trainings (11/2007 and 5/2008);

- Legal research to identify promising approaches and practices;
- SPIG grants on mold and moisture intrusion (Sonoma County), and use of pesticides/IPM in home (L.A.); Senior Mobile Home Parks SHS Reduction (Shasta Cty.); Local Planning (Fresno);
- Legal research on local codes and enforcement practices on key issues;
- Participation on planning group for Tobacco Control Program statewide conference on SHS with major MUH component;
- Interviews with county public health officers to identify needs regarding healthy housing (with other branches in EHIB's division.)
